Vision Statement:


Achieving optimum health and wellness for seniors.

Resource Development Manager's Message to Members:

2013 was a beehive of activity! We had an explosive growth in health and wellness programs, services and participants - up 59%! Thanks to Green Shield Canada, we added free dental hygiene clinics, in response to several requests from older adults.

Our Deaf Seniors Group was very active with many events thanks to the extension of funding from the Pendle Fund at the Community Foundation of Mississauga. The extension allowed us to provide events, interpreters and participation in regular Centre activities. Now that this funding has concluded, we are pleased to announce that new funding has been received from the Rotary Club of Mississauga for 2014.

The Telephone Reassurance Program continued to be a success. In 2013, 24 emergency contacts were notified, potentially reducing more critical situations from arising. Our renewed funding request has been approved and will continue until 2017, thanks to Peel Senior Link, our paymaster for the Ministry of Health LHIN.

Thank you to our dedicated volunteers, members, partners, donors, funders and staff, because we truly could not continue to provide the much needed programs and services without you. Feel free to drop by if you have any suggestions on how we can better serve you.

2013 Highlights

- 1585 program participants compared to 998 in 2012!
- Telephone Reassurance Program (Free) provided to 50 seniors by 18 volunteers, supervised by Square One Older Adult Centre's Volunteer Coordinator. Wellbeing was monitored, isolation and loneliness reduced, thereby enabling seniors to remain secure and independent in their homes. 24 emergency contacts were made; 19,376 phone calls (up from 18,055 in 2012); 2050.75 volunteer service hours provided (up from 1,890.8 in 2012).
- Counselling Program (Free) for 75 seniors (up from 65 in 2012).
- Peer Support Group Programs (Free) served 179 seniors.
- American Sign Language Classes (Free) 33 people trained (2013-14).

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• Seniors' Month Event in June (Free) – 76 participants attended the informative event, "Food Choices – When Money is Tight" (compared to 13 in 2012).



• **Drug Awareness Event in November** (Free) – 85 participants increased their awareness of unintended drug interactions and substance abuse in older adults, enjoyed community agency booths, presentations and refreshments; held in partnership with Peel Regional Police.
